1. General Overview

The Can't You SEA? Youth Exchange was successfully implemented in line with the project application, objectives, and Erasmus+ quality standards. From the perspective of Bridges to Solidarity e.V. as a partner organisation, the project demonstrated strong coordination, clear communication, and a well-structured programme that supported both learning outcomes and participant well-being. The cooperation between the coordinating organisation, applicant organisation, facilitators, and partner organisations was professional and constructive throughout all project phases, including preparation, implementation, and follow-up.

2. Project Management and Coordination

Project management was effective and transparent. The coordinator maintained regular contact with partner organisations and provided clear guidelines regarding timelines, roles, and responsibilities. Preparatory online meetings and clear information packages supported a smooth organisational process. Logistical arrangements, including accommodation, meals, transport, and daily scheduling, were handled reliably. The hosting venue provided suitable conditions for both educational activities and informal interaction, contributing positively to the overall group atmosphere.

3. Implementation and Methodology

The programme was implemented using non-formal education methods that were appropriate for the target group and the project's environmental focus. Activities combined educational sessions, hands-on experiences, group work, and reflection spaces. A particularly strong aspect was the involvement of professionals and facilitators with relevant expertise. Their input provided high-quality information, practical tasks, and real-life perspectives connected to sea pollution, environmental protection, and

sustainable lifestyles. This contributed significantly to the learning depth of the exchange. The balance between structured workshops, interactive methods, and experiential learning was well managed. Day trips and excursions were an important added value, allowing participants to connect the project topics with the local context and better understand the environmental realities of an island country like Cyprus.

4. Results and Impact

The project achieved its main objectives. Participants increased their knowledge of sea pollution, climate change, and sustainable practices, while also developing soft skills such as teamwork, communication, and intercultural understanding. Feedback from participants of Bridges to Solidarity e.V. was consistently positive. They reported high satisfaction with the programme, learning content, group atmosphere, and overall organisation. The exchange also supported motivation for follow-up actions and local dissemination activities after returning to Germany. On an organisational level, the project strengthened partnerships between participating organisations and supported further interest in future Erasmus+ cooperation.

5. Overall Assessment

From the perspective of Bridges to Solidarity e.V., the Can't You SEA? Youth Exchange was a well-managed, meaningful, and impactful project. It combined strong organisational coordination with relevant content, professional facilitation, and positive participant experiences.
