1. General Overview

MERAKI LT participated in the Youth Exchange “*Can't You SEA?*” as a partner organisation and considers the project a relevant and well-executed Erasmus+ initiative. The exchange addressed timely environmental challenges while ensuring a meaningful learning experience for young participants. Throughout the different phases of the project, cooperation among organisations was constructive and solution-oriented. The planning, coordination, and delivery reflected a clear commitment to quality and participant-centred learning.

2. Project Management and Coordination

The coordination of the project was organised in a structured and reliable manner. Communication channels were clear, deadlines were respected, and partners were kept informed at every stage. The preparatory meetings allowed organisations to align expectations and clarify their educational contributions.

During the mobility, practical arrangements were handled effectively, creating a stable framework for the implementation of activities. The accommodation and learning spaces supported both formal workshops and informal intercultural exchange. From our perspective, the management approach allowed partners to focus primarily on educational quality rather than logistical concerns.

3. Implementation and Methodology

The educational programme combined awareness-raising with experiential learning. Participants engaged in discussions, teamwork, outdoor activities, and reflective exercises connected to marine pollution and sustainable living. The learning process encouraged active participation rather than passive listening.

The methodological approach respected non-formal education principles by promoting dialogue, cooperation, and shared responsibility. Participants were not only receivers of information but



contributors to the group's collective understanding. The environmental theme was addressed in a way that connected global ecological concerns with daily behavioural choices.

4. Results and Impact

The exchange contributed positively to the development of both environmental awareness and key competences among participants. Lithuanian participants reported increased understanding of marine ecosystems, climate-related issues, and sustainable practices. In addition, they strengthened communication skills, intercultural sensitivity, and confidence in international settings.

The experience also encouraged participants to reflect on their own lifestyles and consider small but realistic changes within their communities. The project stimulated motivation for further engagement and local-level dissemination.

For MERAKI LT, the project strengthened international cooperation and supported our ongoing efforts to promote youth participation in sustainability-related topics.

5. Overall Assessment

MERAKI LT evaluates the *"Can't You SEA?"* Youth Exchange as a valuable and well-balanced Erasmus+ project. The initiative successfully combined thematic relevance, intercultural dialogue, and non-formal educational methods.
